A MESSAGE TO MEMBERSHIP REGARDING THE CURRENT SPIKE IN COVID-19 NUMBERS

Dear Members:

The Abilene Chamber has received information – provided by local health officials – that the current spike in COVID-19 cases may present a revised challenge to our local economy and our education systems.

Based on today's confirmed cases, health officials project that there could be up-to a four-fold increase over time. By *voluntarily* adding an additional layer of protection through the use of masks, that projection significantly drops. Chamber leadership is working to better understand capacity.

The Chamber applauds the City of Abilene for not requiring an unenforceable mandate on face mask usage. However, in order to adequately police ourselves as businesses and contributors to our economy, the Chamber does support <u>voluntary mask</u> usage within our business community. An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure, as they say.

While nothing guarantees safe passage through the current spike, we have watched our business community innovate its way through the crisis to date. It is the view of the Chamber that any mitigation steps that you are comfortable in supporting to help keep our economy open are encouraged. Ultimately, it comes down to personal responsibility and your chamber encourages individual choice.

Your Chamber continues to monitor the very fluid situation surrounding COVID-19 and request your feedback in our most recent survey surrounding prevention of another economic shutdown, the use of masks in businesses, and our community's ability to ensure our hospital systems aren't overwhelmed. <u>Click here</u> to respond before the deadline of today at 5:00 pm.

TWC PAUSES WORK SEARCH REINSTATEMENT

The Texas Workforce Commission (TWC) announced Tuesday, June 30 that it will delay the reinstatement of the work search requirement for unemployment benefits in Texas. This requirement, which is federal law, was suspended due to the COVID-19 pandemic. From the outset, TWC has stated that bringing back work search would be conditions-based.

"Due to the resurgence of COVID-19 cases in Texas, TWC has decided to pause the return of work search requirements at this time," said Ed Serna, TWC Executive Director. "We will continue to monitor the situation and make further recommendations in late July."

Early Voting for July 14th Primary Runoff Election Begins

"The early voting window for the July 14th primary runoff election is June 29-July 10, extending the length of the early voting period due to the coronavirus pandemic. Polls will be open from 7 am- 7 pm Election Day, July 14th. The Secretary of State's Office has reported that different polling

locations may have to be utilized given the ongoing public health crisis. Voters are encouraged to <u>verify their polling location</u> prior to voting on the Secretary of State's website, or with their county elections office"

Texas RRC Releases Oil and Gas Production Statistics for April 2020

"According to a <u>report released by the RRC</u>, crude oil and natural gas production as reported to the RRC for April 2020 came from 172,505 oil wells and 87,853 gas wells. Total oil production for April 2020 was 121,864,499; down from 142,903,780 in March 2020. From May 2019 to April 2020, total Texas reported production was 1.5 billion barrels of crude oil and 10.4 trillion cubic feet of total gas. Crude oil production reported by the RRC is limited to oil produced from oil leases and does not include condensate."
