TAX RATE INCREASE PROPOSAL

The City of Abilene proposes an increase to the property tax rate for the 2020 tax year. The no-new-revenue rate is .7643 per \$100 valuation and the proposal would increase the rate to point .7877 per \$100 valuation.

The proposed rate is below the voter approval tax rate so the City is not required to hold a public vote to decide on the increase or not. A public hearing will be held on August 13 at City Hall Council Chambers beginning at 8:30 a.m. Citizens may express their support or concerns at the public hearing. According to a statement Mayor Anthony Williams and all Council members are in favor of the rate increase. (Source: KACU)

RECORD ECONOMIC PLUNGE IN SECOND QUARTER

AND BLEAK JOBS NUMBERS REVEAL VIRUS TOLL

The U.S. economy underwent a record-breaking decline of 32.9% in the second quarter, marking the biggest drop on record since 1947. The implications of this sharp decline is evident as another 1.4 million Americans filed for unemployment towards the end of July. However, this period of steep economic decline is likely temporary as most economic analysts expect a stunning rebound to take place during the current third quarter, which will close out in September. TEXAS BRANDED A TOP STATE FOR BUSINESSES TO SURVIVE THE PANDEMIC

A recent study conducted by Fit Small Business ranks Texas as the third best state equipped to survive the economic implications of COVID-19. The researchers weighed five metrics: Economic and Financial Health; Least Economic Stressors; Emergency Reserves and Relief; COVID-19 Rates and Health Care Infrastructure; and Consumer Confidence.

Texas ranked number 1 in the Emergency Reserves and Relief category since the state has the second-highest CARES Act endowment of over \$10 billion. The study also cites the state's economic reserves, wide variety of industries, low cost of living, and other benefits as a solid foundation for economic recovery.
