DOOR-TO-DOOR VISITS BEGIN NATIONWIDE FOR 2020 CENSUS

This week, the U.S. Census Bureau began following up with households nationwide that have not yet responded to the 2020 Census. Based on the current self-response rate of 63.3%, the Census Bureau estimates it will need to visit about 56 million addresses to collect responses in person. Up to 500,000 census takers across the country will go door to door to assist people in responding to the 2020 Census.

Census takers began following up with households on July 16 in a <u>limited number of areas</u> and added additional areas each week thereafter. Starting Aug. 9, all remaining offices began following up with households nationwide. Census takers have completed training on <u>social distancing and safety protocols</u>, will follow local public health guidelines, and will be required to wear a face mask when conducting follow-up visits.

INSIGHTS FROM DALLAS FED SURVEYS: UNEVEN ECONOMIC RECOVERY LIKELY IN TEXAS

With the unusual economic shocks following COVID-19, traditional measures of economic activity have not been timely enough to capture the latest changes in the economy and are likely subject to greater revision than usual. In this environment, surveying businesses on real-time economic conditions becomes even more valuable.

The Dallas Fed's Texas Business Outlook Surveys (TBOS) show that while recovery continued in some sectors in July, it faltered in others as new COVID-19 cases surged

across the state (Chart 1). The surveys have a well-established track record of reliably informing the nation about economic conditions in Texas, and they reflect a large and robust sample, in fact reaching record response numbers amid the pandemic.
