ABILENE RECEIVES \$149,566 IN TCA GRANTS

The Texas Commission on the Arts (TCA) has approved funding for \$12.9 million in grants for fiscal year 2021, including a project for the Abilene Cultural District in the amount of \$94,566. The matching grant will fund the Abilene Cultural Affairs Council's "Freedom to Roam" project designed to light two underpasses to connect the Abilene Cultural District with the SoDA District (South Downtown Abilene) and to commission a signature public sculpture that will be located between the Adamson-Spalding Storybook Garden, the Abilene Convention Center and the new DoubleTree by Hilton hotel. The projects are a

collaboration between the Abilene Cultural Affairs Council, the City of Abilene and SoDA.

The underpass lighting project will include security cameras and will enhance safety and pedestrian traffic between both sides of downtown, which are divided by the North and South 1st railroad tracks that go through the center of town. The lighting project will encourage visitors to travel back and forth at night through the underpass to have a drink, eat dinner and visit venues and outdoor sculptures.

TEXANS SPENT LESS GOING OUT TO EAT AND DRINK, BUT MORE ON HOME IMPROVEMENT AS CORONAVIRUS CASES PEAKED THIS SUMMER

Texas collected about \$2.8 billion in state sales tax revenue in August — 5.6% less than in the same month last year, Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar said Tuesday.

That revenue was based mainly on purchases made in July, when the numbers of coronavirus cases were peaking. That rising rate, the comptroller said, likely put a damper on economic activity.

State sales tax collections from major sectors — except retail trade — declined compared with the same period in 2019, Hegar said. The comptroller said the largest declines happened in sectors related to oil and gas, which includes manufacturing. A Hegar spokesperson also pointed to declines in sectors such as transportation and bars and restaurants.
