SERVICES SECTOR EXPANDS FOR FIFTH STRAIGHT MONTH

The U.S. services sector, where most Americans work, registered its fifth consecutive month of expansion in October.

The Institute for Supply Management reported Wednesday that its index of services activity ticked down to a reading of 56.6 last month, from September's reading of 57.8. Any reading above 50 signifies expansion in services industries such as restaurants, department stores and delivery companies.

The index registered sharp contractions in April and May as shutdowns aimed at containing the coronavirus closed many businesses and put millions of Americans out of work. But starting in June, the index began to rise again and is just below its February level of 57.3.

NEARLY 50% OF U.S. EXPERIENCING DROUGHT

Nearly half of the contiguous U.S. is experiencing some form of drought, according to the latest U.S. Drought Monitor. As of Oct. 27, the data showed that 46% of the U.S. is in drought, up from 42.5% on Sept. 29. Nearly 64.5% of the U.S. is experiencing some form of dryness or drought, up from about 62% on Sept. 29. Eighteen percent of the U.S. is in extreme to exceptional drought, the majority of which is in the western part of the country.

According to the Drought Monitor, a blast of frigid Arctic air recently invaded the north-central states and was accompanied by a slow-moving storm system that produced light snow across most of the Rockies, Plains and upper Midwest.

REVIEW OF THE TEXAS ECONOMY

2020 STATE OF TEXAS ANNUAL CASH REPORT

From August 2019 to August 2020, the Texas economy lost 616,600 nonfarm jobs to reach 12,219,400, largely due to economic shocks from the COVID-19 pandemic and the recent fall in energy prices. This decrease of 4.8 percent was the second smallest percentage loss over this period among the ten most populous states (behind Georgia at 4.2 percent) and the sixteenth smallest loss among all states. Private-sector employment fell by 5.4 percent, while government employment (federal, state and local) fell by 1.4
